Renaissance man turned his gaze backward in historical time. Not to his immediate past which he arrogantly assumed was "dark," but to the classical past of ancient Greece and Rome, which he assumed was bathed in light. There he found a Golden Age. Hellenistic Monarchs down to the Roman Empire. The Hellenistic Age suffers from some of the same disabilities as Late Antiquity, i.e. it doesn't measure up to the brilliance of the Golden Age of Greece and of late Republican and early Imperial Rome.
